**ORDER**

Upon separate motions of the U.S. International Trade Commission and the U.S. Department of Justice (on behalf of itself and the Executive Branch agencies it represents) (“the Agencies”), due to the lapse in the appropriation of the Agencies and to facilitate the management of the Court’s docket, it is hereby

**ORDERED** that, absent other direction or order from the Court, any Agency filing due date occurring during the lapse of appropriation is tolled for a period equal to the number of days of the lapse of appropriation, not to exceed 14 days; and it is further

**ORDERED** that any filing due date in the same case simultaneous to that of such an extended filing due date is similarly extended; and it is further

**ORDERED** that any filing due date in the same case which is contingent upon the filing of a document with such an extended due date is similarly extended.
