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In Re: CORONAVIRUS COVID-19 ORDER CONCERNING FACE MASKS/COVERINGS AND SCREENINGS

ORDER

The U.S. Court of International Trade (Court) continues to evaluate and adjust its response to the COVID-19 virus in accordance with guidance from public health authorities, including the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The CDC guidance, issued July 27, 2021, advised all people, regardless of vaccination status, to wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission to further reduce spread of the coronavirus given new evidence on the Delta variant currently circulating in the United States. Consistent with this guidance and in order to continue to safeguard the health and safety of all visitors to, and employees of, the Court, it is hereby

ORDERED that the Order dated June 22, 2021 (In Re: CORONAVIRUS COVID-19 ORDER CONCERNING FACE MASKS/COVERINGS AND SCREENINGS), is hereby rescinded; it is further

ORDERED that every individual entering the Courthouse, regardless of vaccination status, is required to wear a mask or face-covering over their nose and mouth while in common or public areas of the Courthouse and to observe physical distancing, in accordance with CDC guidance regarding prevention measures;¹ it is further

ORDERED that non-fully-vaccinated individuals² seeking to enter the Courthouse shall undergo COVID-19 screening before being allowed entry, with such screening taking the form of answering questions regarding any recent exposure to COVID-19 and/or other screening methods as appropriate, including a temperature check; it is further

ORDERED that, regardless of vaccination status, no one shall enter the Courthouse if they are feeling sick, have a fever, and/or other symptoms associated with COVID-19,³ have tested

¹ All individuals entering the Courthouse without a mask or face-covering shall be provided a mask by the Court. If no mask is available, or if the mask is refused or otherwise not worn, the individual will be asked to contact the applicable Court office to determine alternate arrangements in order to accomplish their needs without entry to the Courthouse.

² The CDC (and, therefore, the Court) considers a person fully vaccinated for COVID-19 two weeks after their second dose in a 2-dose series (such as the Pfizer or Moderna vaccines) or two weeks after a single-dose vaccine (such as Johnson & Johnson's vaccine). If you do not meet either of these criteria, you are a non-fully-vaccinated individual for purposes of this Order.

³ Symptoms associated with COVID-19 include: cough, shortness of breath, fever, and recent loss of taste or smell.

positive for COVID-19 within the past two weeks, or have been advised to self-quarantine by a doctor, hospital, or health agency within the past two weeks; it is further

ORDERED that policies regarding masks or face-coverings, physical distancing, and other prevention measures, within a courtroom, jury room, or chambers, shall be determined by the presiding judge; it is further

ORDERED that, upon approval of the presiding judge(s), the Clerk's Office will continue to provide access to parties to participate in, and members of the public to listen to, Court proceedings via videoconference and/or teleconference;⁴ and it is further

ORDERED that Court Security Officers are authorized to enforce the above listed requirements and deny entry to, or expel, non-complying individuals.

This Order shall be effective August 2nd, 2021, and remain in effect until amended or vacated.

⁴ Per USCIT Rule 77(d), the use of devices to record or broadcast these proceedings is prohibited. Access for the public may be precluded or limited when confidential information will be presented in a proceeding.
