Advisory Committee Note

The revisions request that the practitioner list on the summons the Center that was assigned to and decided the protest(s), if known, so that the summons may be transmitted directly to the Center upon filing. Where the practitioner lists a Center on the summons, it will be transmitted to that Center. If, however, no Center is listed, the summons will be transmitted to the port(s) of entry. All information currently required on the summons (the protest numbers, entry numbers and ports of entry) remains unchanged. The revisions also delete the requirement that the physical address of the CBP port be listed, add a field for the plaintiff to indicate the court number, and update the language on the summons to reflect current statutory requirements and tariff schedules.
